The Power Pack is an intensive DSE programme. It endeavours to empower S.4-S.6 students to tackle DSE with confidence. Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking sections will be taught over 10 2-hour lessons respectively. The programme dissects each examination paper and teaches the skills and knowledge that DSE aims to test. There are two strands in these programmes to cater for students' different academic level.

Paper 1 | Reading
