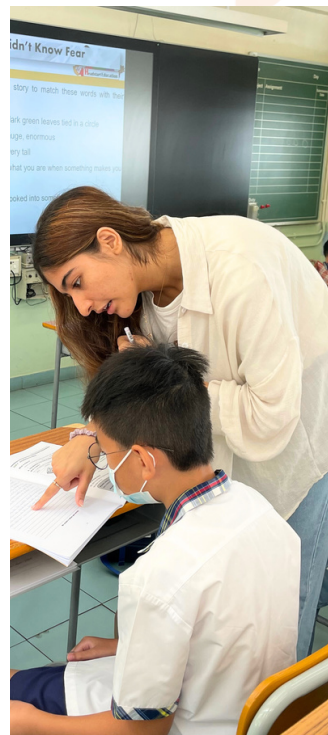


2023 HEADSTART SUMMER PROGRAMMES

ACTIVE LEARNING: GAME-CHANGER TO SHORT ATTENTION SPAN IN GEN Z.

In today's fast-paced world, it's no secret that **attention spans are shrinking**. This is especially true **for Gen Z students**, who have grown up with a constant stream of information at their fingertips. In this article, we'll explore the findings of a recent study on the attention span of Gen Z students, and discuss some **insights and solutions** for educators and parents.



PROPOSALS

1. **Limiting** students' **use of electronic devices** in class
2. Teaching students **strategies for managing distractions**
3. Providing students with **more opportunities for active learning**
4. Creating **more engaging and interactive learning environments**

FINDINGS

A recent study has found that Gen Z students have a **shorter attention span (>20%)** than previous generations. This is likely due to a number of factors, including the **increased use of technology** and **social media**. The study also found that students who are more easily distracted have lower grades and are less likely to graduate from college.

CONCLUSION

The decline in attention span among Gen Z students is a challenge, but it is one that can be overcome. By **working together, educators and parents** can find ways to help students develop the attention skills they need to succeed in school and in life.
